PAULINE FAMILY OPENS THE YEAR OF THE BIBLE

ON NOVEMBER 26, 2020, the Memorial of Blessed James Alberione, the Pauline Family in the Philippines, with the rest of the Paulines all over the world, opened the Pauline Year of the Bible. The Pauline celebration was willed by the General Superiors of the Pauline Family to revive the Pauline spirit and love for the Word of God, and renew the passion of the Founder to which he felt that the Pauline Family was called: *the spreading of the Word of God.* It would allow the Pauline Family to celebrate with gratitude and praise the 50th anniversary of the birth to heaven of Blessed James Alberione in 2021.



The Committee for the celebration of the Year of the Bible of the Pauline Family comes out with this first issue of the Information Bulletin of the PF Year of the Bible. It is called **WPRDWAVE** which joins the Word of God with "wave" that makes the Word spread speedily in the digital world. While the Institutes of the Pauline Family have platforms to share their biblical initiatives, the Committee finds it appropriate and useful to have a common printed bulletin not only for sharing but also for serving as record and reference of this important event in the Pauline Family. The Superiors General established the Central Commission for the Bible Year. Following its direction, the Pauline Superiors in the Philippines likewise appointed representatives to form the local Committee for the Bible Year to help come out with proposals and initiatives for the biblical year.

For the celebration on November 26. the Pauline Family held a double celebration both streamlined live from the Sanctuary of St. Paul in Makati. At 8:00 AM, Pauline delegates led the celebration of Lauds (Morning Praise) which was carried all over the country. At 3:30 PM the Eucharistic celebration was attended by the SSP Makati community and by a limited representation of Paulines due to protocols imposed by the pandemic. Fr. Lawrence De Peralta, one of the younger priests, presided at the celebration and gave the homily. For the opening of the Bible Year, the Provincial Superiors jointly unveiled the logo at the altar with the slogan, "That the Word of the Lord may speed forward" (2 Thes 3:1). Fr. Gil Alinsangan, SSP, the coordinator of the Committee for the Bible Year explained its mandate and asked for the collaboration of all.

At the end of the celebration, the attendees gathered for the $agap\bar{e}$ at Don Zanoni Gym. For this year's celebration of the Founder's Day, it was the turn of the Aggregated Institutes and the Association of Pauline Cooperators to play hosts.

Biblical Initiatives

For the Year of the Bible, the Paulines in the Philippines have enhanced their study and meditation on the Word of God through the practice of *lectio divina* and organizing biblical reflections and seminars. On the part especially of the Society of St. Paul and the Daughters of St. Paul, there has been an increase in biblical initiatives through publications, TV and radio programs, and websites. Being maximized are existing media platforms for Gospel reflections (Gospel Power, Bible Diary, *Sambuhay* Interaktib, St Paul National Bible Quiz, *Mabuting Balita, Ang Bibliya Ngayon*, etc.).






A SONG FOR THE BIBLE YEAR

At the start of the year 2021, the various institutes of the Pauline Family collaborated with the Daughters of St. Paul in their FB program Mabuting Balita. Representatives from the SSP, FSP, PDDM, SGBP, IOLA, APC, and IHF share their pastoral reflections on the assigned Gospel reading of the day. This initiative aims to respond to two goals: 1) to help people get acquainted with the reading of the Bible, and with suggested pastoral reflections, to lead them to a deeper love for the Word of God; and 2) to promote the Pauline Family in the pastoral care of vocations. At the end of this special year, it is projected that 365 videos of Mabuting Balita would be produced and uploaded in the internet and other social media platforms.

THE PAULINE LOGO BIBLE YEAR

The logo is inspired by two biblical images: the **sower** (Lk. 8:4-15) and the **runner** (1 Co. 9:24). Both biblical references indicate an action to be carried out with a sense of responsibility and urgency. The sower must sow in such a way as to expect an abundant harvest in due time. The runner, after sufficient preparation, must win the race. The combination of these two references brings us to the theme of the *Pauline Family's Year of the Bible: "that the Word of the Lord may speed forward"* (2 Thes. 3:1).

So as to avoid bewildering the observer, the logo employs simple shapes and colors. The sower, depicted as leaning forward, tosses into the air 10 seeds symbolizing the 10 branches of the Pauline Family. The different sizes of the seeds and the different directions in which they move indicate the different services of the various branches of the PF and the different spheres of society in which they have been called to root themselves. Red. on the other hand, is the universal color of *zeal* and *passion*. The color of blood, it motivates us to fix our gaze on an urgent goal: that the Word of the Lord might be disseminated far and wide.
